



**Sermon Title**: No Such Thing as a Solitary Christian

Scripture: Mark 1:14-20

Do you want to deepen your faith? Want to be a better follower of Jesus? One of the first things we see Jesus do when he begins his ministry is gather a group of companions. There are all kinds of reasons this was necessary. Jesus was a teacher and needed students. He knew his time was limited and his disciples would be tasked to carry on his work. But in gathering a group of companions, Jesus also revealed a truth and pattern for the Christian life — we can't follow Jesus all by ourselves. This sermon will explore the importance of community in Jesus' life, in the early church, and for us today.


